## PROJECT UPDATE

### Progress

A bit of site work got done before the snow flew. One half of the overflow parking lot got poured, grading has been done for the north section of the ring road, and numerous landscaping materials, trees and bushes were planted.

At Martin Health Center, the area known as the C/D hall and entrance have been closed and the demolition of those spaces has begun. In the old dining room, significant progress has been made with ceiling work and drywall nearing completion.

### Upcoming Work

PJ Hoerr and Stark are working hard to get the rest of the overflow parking and north section of the ring road done before Thanksgiving. We will need cooperation from the weather, and from the forecast it looks like we should get warm enough temperatures to complete this work. The landscaper will return and has a number of items still to go in including a couple of replacements as our materials are warranted. You will see a large tree go in outside of Building 3 in the area that will face the Assisted Living building. It is being planted now because we will have some trees that have to come down next spring.

At Martin Health Center interior demolition will continue and exterior building demolition (that is, demolition of the old entrance) will begin. Expect that you'll see sitework outside the old entrance of Martin Health Center beginning with asphalt removal and earthwork to configure a new parking area.

In the old dining room, the drywall finishing will be complete. Casework will be delivered, including tops, and by the end of the next two weeks equipment will be delivered and final trim-out begun.

**Of Note:** There has been much activity in the area that was vacated in Martin Health Center. A great deal of that has been partners in the community coming in to get the beds, dressers and other equipment from the vacated resident rooms. These items have been donated to numerous organizations in our community including Heartland Community College, McLean County Nursing Home and Recycling for Families. We were even able to donate a popcorn machine to the Boys & Girls Club. Hopefully that puts a smile on each of our faces.
